Mansfield Wildlife Shelter & Rescue received

\$7,948.71 to help care for the wombats, kangaroos, joeys, koalas, eagles, possums, sugar

gliders, hawks and galahs that are currently in their care. Funds received from the golf day will also be put to use on the current building projects at the shelter, namely a new marsupial enclosure and an isolation enclosure with multiple pens for different species which will help immensely during natural disasters when they are inundated with animals. MWSR is a 24 hour a day, 7 days a week, not for profit organisation focused on the rescue and rehabilitation of sick and injured wildlife.



SecondBite received \$23,500

SecondBite has grown exponentially, and this year plans to redistribute 1050 tonnes to welfare agencies which run community food programs for people in need. With the cost of living on the rise and housing affordability a major problem, 1.2 million Australians are now food insecure. SecondBite now has 36 agencies on its waiting list for distribution of fresh surplus food. This, together with an increasing demand for fresh food, has meant that it is now moving to larger premises in Kensington with 4 times the capacity of its current warehouse, to satisfy this demand.

In addition to this growth, SecondBite has conceived a new distribution model called SecondBite Community Connect, which will enable it to roll out its operation nationally over the next 3 years. It is designed to ensure that a supply of surplus fresh food is available to regional and rural parts of Australia and to promote localised and sustainable solutions to food insecurity. Community Connect allows for any existing community food program in urban, rural and regional areas to access local surplus food safely & efficiently without the need for a SecondBite van. It is run by the community for the community. It enables local food programs to redirect funds that would normally be used to purchase food, to other areas of need within their organisations. The model has been piloted and evaluated and was found to be economical, efficient and most importantly, it ensures best practise is followed.

The funds obtained from The Heritage Finance Charity Golf Day will be put towards this National Food Program Expansion and Community Connect. Thank you from SecondBite

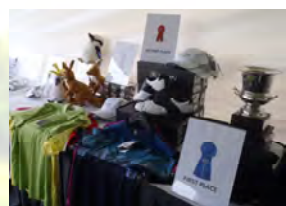
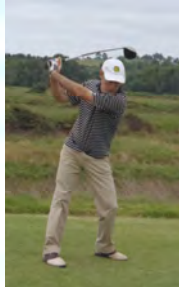
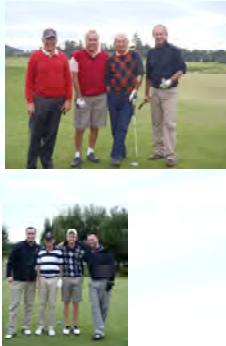


BrainLink

Reducing incidence and impact of brain disorders in our community.

Brainlink received \$23,500 which will be used as part of BrainLink's approach to more effective communication with families and to ensure they access Brainlink's services in a timely manner. BrainLink will provide a new dedicated Acquired Brain Disorder (ABI) **Crisis Response Liaison** to be stationed predominately in the

neurological ward of a major Melbourne hospital. The Liaison's role will be to provide personal face-to-face contact to those diagnosed with ABI and their families. The aim of this exciting new role will be promoting a faster recovery and transition to the community, maximising independence and improving the health and well-being of a person diagnosed with ABI and their family.



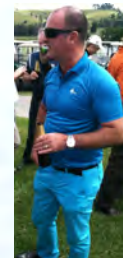
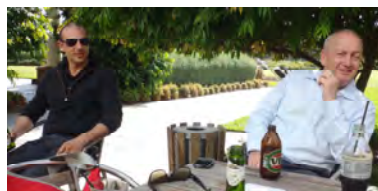
